

EVENT SUMMARY


The Ogbomoso Digital Economy Summit, the largest and most strategic gathering of economic stakeholders in Ogbomoso, hosted 1,200 participants and 18 guest speakers for its maiden edition on November 17, 2022. Also, working in different units to ensure the success of the Summit were about 100 volunteers.

The Summit had a total of 2 keynote speeches, 4-panel sessions, and 6 lightning talks across a variety of different speakers from within and outside the country. 

Location:


91.95% of the attendees were from Oyo State, with the majority coming from Ogbomoso and a few people from Ibadan and other towns in Oyo State.

1.6% were from within Osun State, and1.5% were from other states in Nigeria(Abuja, Ondo, Ogun, Ekiti, Edo, and Jos).




EMPLOYMENT STATUS OF ATTENDES




LOCATION OF RESIDENCE




Organization type



NEXT STEPS

The Ogbomoso Enterprise Fund

The Ogbomoso Enterprise Fund will be a dedicated fund administered by a special board. The fund will focus on:

- Infrastructure (digital and electrical infrastructure, workspaces, affordable housing for the digital economy workers etc.)
- Investment in startups with viable tech products and tech-enabled services.
- Funding the upskilling and training of residents of tech-enabled.
- Innovation catalysation (R&D).

Digital Ogbomoso Think Tank

The Digital Ogbomoso Think Tank will be made up of the most experienced and cerebral minds from the Ogbomoso community both home and abroad. They will work together to develop a 2030 Roadmap for the development of Ogbomoso's Digital Economy.

The Ogbomoso Workforce Revolution (TOWeR)

TOWeR will focus on training 50,000 youths in highly sought-after digital, tech and cognitive skills by 2030. This ensures that there's a significant depth and breadth in the expertise available within the ecosystem for global competitiveness.
